From the Pastor's Laptop


In a few weeks I will move to my new home, **Thomas Aquinas College** ("TAC"). I thought you might like to know a little more about it.

Three professors from St. Mary's College near Oakland established TAC 40 years ago. They wanted to provide a pure liberal arts curriculum, challenging students to work through the masters of western thought, from Plato to Augustine to Einstein. Every student takes exactly the same courses (a "single, integrated curriculum"), fostering intelligent student discussion outside of class. Students study only original works — 100 "great books" of Western civilization. They don't study *textbooks* about geometry or physics or philosophy — they actually read the original works of Euclid, Galileo and Aristotle.



The founders also sought to establish a college of the highest Catholic standards. The \$22 million chapel is the center of the campus, and all dorms are named after saints. Three full-time priests provide four Masses and 10 scheduled confession times a day. While most Catholic colleges often promote student life contrary to Catholic morality, and teach courses opposed to Catholic doctrine, TAC is joyously faithful to the teaching authority of the Catholic Church.

Currently, 360 students come from 38 states and six foreign countries, and there is one teacher to every 11 students. The campus is situated about a half hour east of Ventura on 131 acres of steeply wooded land.

The *Princeton Review* and *US News and World Report* both rated TAC "Top Tier" and "Best Value" among American colleges in 2010. I invite you all to send your children to TAC, at least for a visit. You can see the College on its website and are most welcome to visit me on the campus at any time. It's one of America's finest Catholic schools, and I am most privileged to be associated with Thomas Aquinas College.



Following the *Little Way* in our journey to Heaven, we discover that it is always easier to travel in the company of others and to enlist their help when needed. We all remember hearing our parents or grandparents tell us about our Guardian Angel and how this being was to protect and guard us, but as we grew up, somehow the presence of the angel was no longer discussed or felt. Many of us even view the existence of our Guardian Angel as a cute fairy tale told to children. Nonsense! Since when do we grow up and become so sophisticated in our thought that the truths of God and His gifts are filed away as fiction and figments of our imagination? When will we wake up and make use of all that our dear Father in Heaven has given us to be able to get back home? It is as though we were in the sea, in the midst of a great storm (our daily spiritual combat), tossed about by the huge waves of temptations and suddenly, a celestial friend who always has been there, extends his hand to keep us from drowning and we in turn, push him aside and refuse his help. We do this every time we ignore the promptings of our Guardian Angel, every time we do not acknowledge his great help. He has been entrusted with guiding us to heaven. Archbishop Chaput's homily to close the Fortnight for Freedom

Below is the full text of the address from the Archbishop of Philadelphia, given at the *Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception* in Washington, D.C.:

(Part II)

And that raises some unsettling questions: What do you and I, and all of us, really render to God in our personal lives? If we claim to be disciples, then what does that actually mean in the way we speak and act?

Thinking about the relationship of Caesar and God, religious faith and secular authority, is important. It helps us sort through our different duties as Christians and citizens. But on a deeper level, Caesar is a creature of this world, and Christ's message is uncompromising: We should give Caesar nothing of ourselves. Obviously we're in the world. That means we have obligations of charity and justice to the people with whom we share it. Patriotism is a virtue. Love of country is an honorable thing. As Chesterton once said, if we build a wall between ourselves and the world, it makes little difference whether we describe ourselves as locked in or locked out.

But God made us for more than the world. Our real home isn't here. The point of today's Gospel passage is not how we might calculate a fair division of goods between Caesar and God. In reality, it all belongs to God and nothing – at least nothing permanent and important – belongs to Caesar. Why? Because just as the coin bears the stamp of Caesar's image, we bear the stamp of God's image in baptism. We belong to God, and only to God.

In today's second reading, St. Paul tells us, "Indeed religion" — the RSV version says "godliness" — "with contentment is great gain. For we brought nothing into the world, just as we shall not be able to take anything out of it." True freedom knows no attachments other than Jesus Christ. It has no love of riches or the appetites they try to satisfy. True freedom can walk away from anything — wealth, honor, fame, pleasure. Even power. It fears neither the state, nor death itself.

Who is the most free person at anything? It's the person who masters her art. A pianist is most free who — having mastered her instrument according to the rules that govern it and the rules of music, and having disciplined and honed her skills — can now play anything she wants.

The same holds true for our lives. We're free only to the extent that we unburden ourselves of our own willfulness and practice the art of living according to God's plan. When we do this, when we choose to live according to God's intention for us, we are then — and only then — truly free.


En unas pocas semanas me moveré a mi Nuevo hogar, **Thomas Aquinas College** ("TAC"). Pensé que les gustaría saber un poco más sobre este lugar.

Tres profesores del College de St. Mary's cerca a Oakland lo establecieron hace cuarenta años. Ellos querían proveer un currículo de artes liberales puras, retar a los estudiantes a aprender de los maestros del pensamiento occidental, tales como desde Platón a Agustín y a Einstein. Cada estudiante toma los mismos cursos ("un currículo integrado"), el cual conduce a inteligentes decisiones fuera de clase. Los estudiantes estudian solo trabajos originales—100 "Libros estupendos" de la civilización Occidental. Ellos no estudian libros de texto sobre geometría o física o filosofía— sino que leen los trabajos de Euclides, Galileo y Aristóteles.



Los fundadores también trataron de establecer un colegio Católico con los niveles más altos. La capilla de \$22 millones es el centro de la universidad y todos los dormitorios llevan nombres de santos. Tres sacerdotes de tiempo-completo ofrecen cuatro Misas y diez confesiones a diferentes horas del día. Mientras que la mayoría de las universidades promueven una vida estudiantil contraria a la moral Católica, y enseñan cursos opuestos a la doctrina Católica, TAC es gozosamente fiel a la autoridad de enseñanza de la Iglesia Católica.

Corrientemente, la universidad cuenta con 360 estudiantes provenientes de 38 estados y seis países extranjeros, y un profesor por

cada once estudiantes. Está localizado como a media hora al oriente de Ventura en 131 acres de bosque. *El Princeton Review, US News and World Report*, le han otorgado a TAC la marca de "Primera Clase" y "Mejor Valor" entre los colegios Americanos en el año 2010. Homilía del Arzobispo Chaput cerrando la Quincena por la Libertad

Traducción de la homilía del Arzobispo de Filadelfia, dada en la Basílica del Santuario Nacional de la Inmaculada Concepción en Washington, DC: (Parte II)

Y esto da paso a perturbantes preguntas: ¿Qué le ofrecemos ustedes, yo y todos nosotros a Dios en nuestras vidas personales? Si nos llamamos discípulos, entonces ¿Qué quiere decir en realidad la manera en que nos comportamos o que hablamos? Pensar en la relación entre el Cesar y Dios es importante al hablar de la fe religiosa y la autoridad seglar. Nos ayuda a ordenar nuestros deberes como cristianos y ciudadanos. Pero en un sentido aun más profundo, el Cesar es una criatura de este mundo, y el mensaje de Cristo no se compromete: No debemos de darle al Cesar nada de nosotros mismos. Obviamente nos

encontramos en el mundo. Eso quiere decir que tenemos obligaciones de caridad y justicia para con los que las compartimos. El patriotismo es una virtud. El amor al país es una cosa honorable. Como Chesterton dijo una vez, si construimos una pared entre nosotros y el mundo, no hace mucha diferencia si decimos que estamos encerrados desde afuera o desde adentro. Pero Dios nos ha hecho para algo más que lo de este mundo. Nuestro real hogar no se encuentra aquí. El punto del Evangelio de hoy no es solamente como podemos calcular una división justa entre lo que le pertenece al Cesar y a Dios.

En realidad, todo le pertenece a Dios y nada—al menos nada permanente e importante—le pertenece al Cesar. ¿Por qué? Porque así como la moneda tiene la imagen del Cesar, nosotros llevamos la imagen de Dios en desde el bautismo. Le pertenecemos a Dios, y solo a Dios. En la segunda lectura, San Pablo nos dice, “En realidad la religión es un buen negocio, pero en otro sentido, si gracias a ella nos conformamos con lo que tenemos. Pues al llegar al mundo no trajimos nada y al dejarlo tampoco nos llevamos nada.” La verdadera libertad no está sujeta a nada más que a Jesucristo. No tiene ningún amor por las riquezas o los apetitos que estos tratan de satisfacer. La verdadera libertad puede dejarlo todo—riqueza, honor, fama, placer. Hasta el poder. No le teme al estado, ni a la misma muerte. ¿Quién es la persona más libre que cualquier otra? Es aquella que es ama de su arte. Un pianista es más libre cuando —es amo de su instrumento de acuerdo a las reglas que lo gobiernan y las reglas musicales, y habiendo disciplinado y refinado su talento— puede entonces tocar lo que quiera. Lo mismo acontece en nuestras vidas. Somos libres solo hasta el punto que dejemos nuestra obstinación y practiquemos el arte de vivir de acuerdo con el plan de Dios. Cuando hagamos esto, y escojamos vivir de acuerdo con la intención de Dios para nuestras vidas— entonces—y solamente entonces —seremos verdaderamente libres.

El mandato de contracepción del Departamento de Salud y Servicios Humanos de los EE UU es solo una de las amenazas mas recientes y publicas. Pero también hay muchas otras. Por ejemplo, el cambio lento entre *libertad religiosa a libertad de culto* en el lenguaje político es una manera muy sutil— y muy peligrosa—de la determinación de limitar las actividades religiosas a cuatro paredes y así eliminarlas por completo de la plaza publica.

Por favor tome el tiempo de escribirle a sus representantes federales el Presidente Obama, los Senadores y Representantes — pidiéndoles que reversen esta moda en nuestra sociedad por medio de legislación y acciones ejecutivas razonables.


