A "School of Prayer" for 50 Years

Our young children and young people have headed back to their classes and colleges. Our Parish School of Religion has also been preparing for the start of the new catechism school year, where prayer is the center of all curriculum.

Pope John Paul II instructed, "Yes... our Christian communities must become genuine "schools" of prayer, where the meeting with Christ is expressed not just in imploring

help but also in thanksgiving, praise, adoration, contemplation, listening and ardent devotion. until the heart truly "falls in love". Intense prayer, yes, but it does not distract us from our commitment to history: by opening our heart to the love of God it also opens it to the love of our brothers and sisters, and makes us capable of shaping history according to God's plan."1

I heard once that if a catechism teacher could only teach his or her students how to pray, that would be the most important instruction, as they will have started them on a relationship with our living God. We have been blessed over the past 50 years by catechism teachers who have sacrificed thousands of hours to ensure that the next generation of Catholics know how to pray, as well as understand and love our faith. Several years ago, we began a new catechism program for our youngest parishioners (age 3-5), "Catechesis of the Good Shepherd" (CGS) which is a Catholic, Montesorri-based program. Through generous parishioner benefactors, we were able to

fully convert two classrooms with small tables and chairs and objects that help our youngest love our living God. CGS is a very prayerful catechesis, and as children already have a prayerful attitude, it is important to nurture this important quality.

Our parish was built over the past 50 years by enthusiastic pastors, sacrificial giving of our parishioners and the powerful result of prayer

> put into action. The facilities, especially our Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration Chapel, help us to grow in faith as we become. even more, a shrine to the Fucharist. Let us take advantage of our facilities, our prayerful and welcoming people so

that we too can become a people and place like the Holy Family in Nazareth, where we live in prayerful communion with Jesus, Mary and Joseph.

Mildred, who always had a rosary in her hand, had three sisters who were Notre Dame Nuns. They both worked hard over the years, Joseph as a graphic designer for the Budweiser Brewery. 




