Fr. Mark:



The months of May and June are a time of transformation. The cool, rainy springtime changes into a hot summer. The school year becomes vacation time for our children. Some graduate and move on in life. The young people on the cover of this magazine became all smiles when they received St. Joseph's scholarships

to attend either Catholic elementary schools, colleges or become NET Evangelists in the fall. Conversely, the adults of our parish are just beginning their classes to learn the faith every Wednesday night with the "Foundations of the Faith," and our men are being transformed by gathering every Wednesday morning at 6:00 AM. Teenagers will be transformed into adults in the faith by receiving Confirmation. Children are transformed by First Confession and especially by First Communion, when they receive for the first time the Sacred Host, which was transformed into the Bread of Life. In fact, all of us at St. Joseph's should try to be transformed by the Lord into saints!

"We want our hearts to catch on fire with the love of God"

May 26 is the Feast day of a great saint whose heart caught on fire with love that enabled him to transform the Church of Rome: St. Phillip Neri. He renounced his family wealth and went to Rome to prepare for the priesthood. He lived simply and spent his days helping the poor and sick and often spent his nights praying in churches and in underground catacombs. On the vigil of Pentecost in 1544, he was praying in the Catacomb of St. Sebastian and he saw



"The Saint of a Joyful Heart"

a vision of the Holy Spirit in the form of a ball of fire, which entered his mouth and descended into his chest where he felt a fire of divine love. He felt such a great heat that he had to open his shirt and lie flat on the cold stone floor to cool himself. Even years later he would sometimes go into ecstasies of prayer in which his heart would beat violently and he would register a high temperature. His biographer wrote that even in winter he would "uncover his chest, open the doors and windows of his room at night, and use fans and other means of creating a draft so as to cool the divine fire within" (Antonio Gallonio #13). After his death, an autopsy showed that several ribs were displaced to give room for his enlarged heart! He had the gifts of tears, levitation, bilocation, prophecy and of healing. He could tell the future, read people's minds and cast out demons. He even raised a fourteen-year-old boy from the dead. His joy was contagious and he led crowds of young people on foot to visit the great churches, which started the tradition of visiting the major basilicas of Rome, especially during Holy Years such as the current Jubilee Year of Mercy. He was called "the apostle of Rome" the "Roman Socrates" and "the Saint of a Joyful Heart." He once said "A joyful heart is more easily made perfect than a downcast one."

We all need a fire in our heart. The warmer weather should remind us that our hearts need to heat up and burn with love! It is interesting that the months of May and June are dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary and the Sacred Heart of Jesus, respectively. These two hearts were so united that they are always depicted similarly as being pierced and burning with love. Many saints have had visions in which they see fire coming out of the Heart of Jesus or the Heart of Mary. We know that Jesus Himself said that He wants this fire to begin to glow and grow in our hearts as well: "I have come to cast fire upon the earth; and my only desire is that it was already kindled (Luke 12:49).

Since 2016 is the Jubilee Year of Mercy, we have been trying to change our hearts by practicing the Works of Mercy in our parish. In May we will try to "Comfort the Afflicted;" and in June we will focus on "Visiting the Sick." By doing these things we hope that our hearts will feel the same love that burned in the heart of St. Phillip Neri, in the Immaculate Heart of Mary our Mother, and in the Sacred Heart of Our Lord Himself.

Sunday, May 29, is the Feast of Corpus Christi and we will have our second annual Eucharistic Procession through the streets near our parish. Last year we had over 700 people join in the procession despite the extreme afternoon heat! Hopefully we will have even more people willing to follow Jesus who wants to "cast fire upon the earth" with His love! On Saturday, June 11, the men of our parish and of the entire region will gather in our parish hall for the "Central Valley Catholic Men's Conference." They will hear inspiring talks from nationally-known speakers, share food and fellowship with other Catholic men, and then process into the church for Eucharistic Holy Hour. After that they will be ready to go out in the world with their hearts on fire.

- Help elderly sign, address and mail Christmas cards.
- Volunteer to read to the blind.
