Christ Centered

Following the call of Pope John Paul II, our school of religion strives to make every teaching moment an encounter and exchange with the person of Jesus Christ. With this in mind, Jesus is never a subject of teaching, rather he is the teaching; it's source and strength. Keeping this in mind, we always work to make our classes an opportunity for growth in faith and engagement with mystery and not merely a presentation of a disconnected 'top of the day.' This approach is easier for volunteer catechists because it keeps their students focused on Jesus and interested students are always easier to teach.

Help with lesson planning

Our curriculum for the year is planned in advance with one-page teacher guides for each lesson. Teachers meet as part of their regular teaching commitment for 15 minute meetings to hone their skill and stay informed throughout the school year.



Parent Centered

Our School of Religion strives to be a **"family-centered"** program. We partner with parents to nourish and develop children's faith according to the basic principle defined by the Church: **Parents are the primary educators of their children.** Our classroom volunteers work to support the efforts of parents, but we assume that parents are the primary educators of their children in the faith, teaching both traditional prayers and the art of prayer, attending Mass every Sunday together as a family, and leading them in living a life a charity.



Teacher or catechist?

The term catechist is often used without considering its full meaning. The bottom-line difference is this: a teacher teaches about some-**thing** and a catechist 'hands-on' some-**one**. A catechist 'echo's down' faith in Jesus Christ and life in his Church. This meaning 'echo-down' follows the original Greek word that was first used in this way by Saint Paul. At St. Joseph's we strive to 'echo' God's voice and move away from merely teaching him as another interesting subject like history or biology. We do this because God's love and grace are real, present and active in his Church today. Catholicism is not only history, it's mystery.
